

Today is Easter Sunday, concluding the season of Lent. Worship during Lent has drawn on resources from Mennonite Church USA: *Upside Down & Inside Out*. God meets us where we are and loves us as we are – yet does not stop there, but turns our understanding upside down and inside-out. Each Sunday, we move beyond a “First Look” at scripture to consider a “Second Look” and an encounter with scripture beyond Sunday worship. This week, consider: *How can you experience God's living presence in the tangible details of daily life? Where is Jesus calling your name, and surprising you with new dimensions of life?*
