- 230 Ne Neufeld, Alfred, *What We Believe Together*, 2015. This book explores seven convictions shared by Anabaptist churches worldwide.

- 242 Hi Hickman, Martha Whitmore, 2002. These are daily meditations for working through grief.
- 261.2 Sh Shenk, David W., *Christian, Muslim, Friend*, 2014. Shenk lays out twelve ways that Christians can form authentic relationships with Muslims.
- 297 Su/Ha Suyanto, Agus and Rev. Paulus Hartono, *The Radical Muslim and Mennonite*, 2015. This book is a story of an uneasy encounter for building peace in Indonesia between the Hizbullah and the Mennonite.
