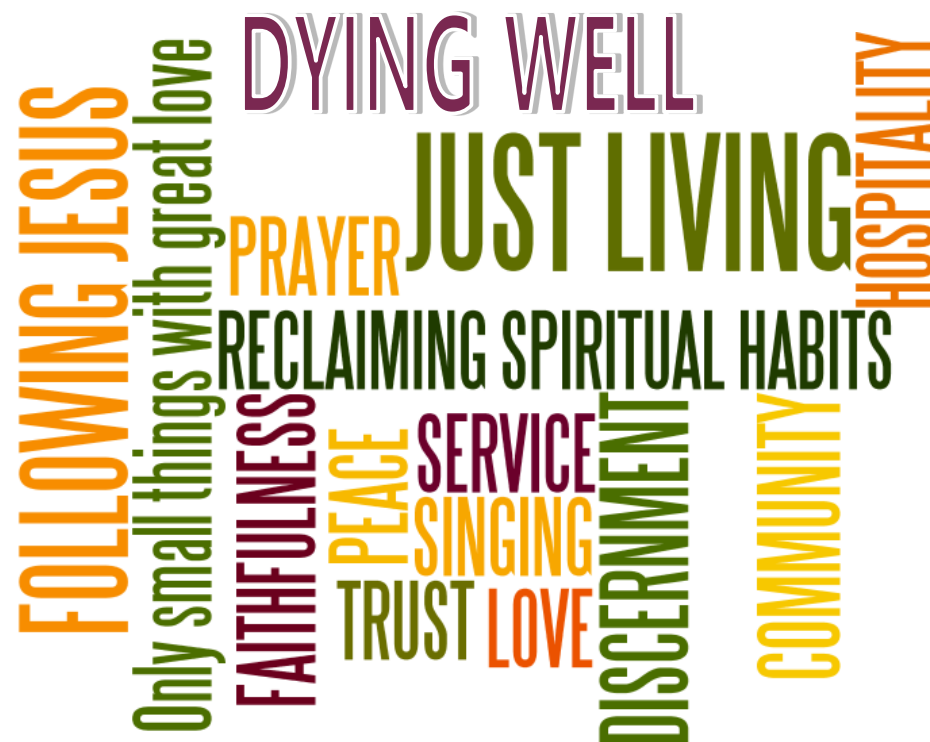

July contributions to the annual budget were \$44,649 compared to expenses of \$38,674. As a result the deficit for the year was reduced to \$10,140 compared to a \$697 surplus a year ago.
