

REMEMBERING 50 years of the MCC relief sale in Kansas. In 1980 --by counting cars and multiplying by four--organizers estimated attendance at 15,452. MCC Central States director Griselda Shelly set up a multi-media program showing relief programs supported by sale income. Verenike with ham gravy went for 75 cents. Borscht was 85 cents. 367 quilts and comforters brought in \$47,357. A total of \$206,712 went to MCC, including \$5,434 from Kansas Mennonite Men's Chorus concerts.

This year's Kansas Mennonite Relief Sale is April 13-14.
