

REMEMBERING 50 years of the MCC Relief Sale in Kansas

In 1992, the collection of pennies and pocket change raised more than \$10,000 and provided an opportunity for people of all ages to talk about the work of MCC. 18,684 verenike and 43,000 New Year's Cookies were made, 1,280 pies collected, and a "House Against Hunger" auctioned. The Environmental Concerns Committee grappled with how to handle the waste and trash from the event, and promoted recycling. An estimated 31,000 attended, including busloads from Emporia, Burdett, Lincoln, Colby, Concordia, Newton, Goessel and Moundridge. **With a theme of "Praising God Through Service," this year's Kansas Mennonite Relief Sale is April 13-14.**
