REMEMBERING 50 years of the MCC Relief Sale in Kansas

With a theme of “Extreme World Makeover,” the 2006 sale was marked by many firsts. The Kansas State Fair’s master plan allowed use of the same buildings as in 2005. Sunflower South saw the first “Silent Auction,” a great success. In Sunflower North, the MCC booth expanded to include school kit assembly. The Domestic Arts building became home to “Caps Central.” The Pretty Prairie Youth Group provided carnival games in the Tech Building. A change in state policy led organizers to buy two construction trailers to convert into kitchens for the Domestic Arts Building. \$450,000 went to MCC. **With a theme of “Praising God Through Service,” this year’s Kansas Mennonite Relief Sale is April 13-14.**
