Peace and Reconciliation

The dove and olive branch motif is rooted in the 8th chapter of Genesis. The sign to Noah that the flood waters were subsiding was the return to the ark of a dove with an olive leaf in its beak. This signified that peace was again restored between God and humanity. Within the Christian tradition the dove and olive branch have signified peace and reconciliation.

The dove is placed within a design that alludes to a landscape with lifting clouds at the top, a glowing sun, and suggestions of water and land below. The sun is a traditional symbol for Christ based on the prophecy of Malachi 4:2: But unto you who revere my name shall the sun of righteousness rise, with healing in its wings."

Humility and Service

Found in the account of the Passover supper, the pitcher, basin and towel have become Christian symbols for humility and service.

"Then he poured water into a basin, and began to wash the disciples' feet, and to wipe them with the towel that was tied around him." John 13:5

In this panel design stylized images of a pitcher, basin and towel are placed together on a surface that could be a table. Superimposed over these objects is an olive branch. This motif, as well as color, is used to tie the design of the two panels together.
