Welcome visitors and friends! May you sense God's presence at BCMC. <u>Personal hearing devices</u> are at the north sanctuary entrance. <u>The nursery</u> at rear of sanctuary is available during worship for families with infants and toddlers. Following Time with Children, children receive activity bags to use during worship (return to baskets at the entrance as you leave). We invite members and visitors to fill out welcome/prayer cards in pew racks and place them in the offering plates for response by pastoral staff.

Today we celebrate Pentecost Sunday through gifts of the Spirit shown through art, music, ministry and the Lord's Table. The visual panels in the front of the sanctuary were designed by Bob Regier, as well as the bulletin cover featuring art installations at BCMC. Following worship, all are invited to view this art as you go to Fellowship Hall downstairs for coffee and fellowship. The wood sculpture Many Gifts, One Spirit in the south entrance on the wall above the stairs was created by John Gaeddert and commissioned by the BCMC Art Committee, thanks to support from the Elda Yoder Memorial Fund. In Fellowship Hall see the clay mural We are the Church Together, originally created by grades K-8 students in the 1997 Summer Sunday School to mark BCMC's100th anniversary. The students studied the history, structure, and art of BCMC and created drawings which were transferred to clay. LaDonna Unruh Voth and Kathy Schroeder directed the project, Conrad Snider was artistic and technical coordinator, and many other BCMC members helped teach, supervise, provide transportation, and lead devotions. Facility update: Repairs and improvements have recently been made on the stained-glass windows in the chapel, funded by the Elda Yoder Memorial Fund, other memorial funds, and Facilities Committee annual budget. Windows were repaired, cleaned, and covered with a protective ¹/₄ inch plate. Similar work was done on the trinity windows in the sanctuary in 2014.

Financial update: Bethel College Mennonite Church received \$33,570 in a charitable bequest from the Esther J. Bartel Estate Donor Advised Fund administered by The Mennonite Foundation. The Church Board will start exploring possible use of the bequest at its June 7 meeting. Bequests often provide the opportunity to fund projects that cannot be funded through the annual budget. At their May 7 meeting the Church Board asked the Finance Committee "to determine short-term management of the funds". The Finance Committee has decided to create the Esther Bartel Bequest Fund to account for the bequest. Short-term use of the funds will be as an interest-free internal loan to pay down the interest-bearing bank loan for Living Stones. The Bartel Bequest Fund will be fully repaid as BCMC members continue to contribute to Living Stones.
