BCMC will share summary notes from Church Board and commission meetings for the next few months: Church Board (Jan 7, 2016) Devotions by Lou Gomez using John 1:3-6. Report from Lead Pastor Search Committee. The Treesuwar's report included positive reputs of the 2015.

Committee. The Treasurer's report included positive results of the 2015 fiscal year, a breakdown of donations by age and pledge, the creation of a Church Retreat Fund. The 2016 proposed budget was presented, discussed and approved for congregational action. The Jan. 24 congregational meeting agenda was approved. A "Crisis Plan" dealing with "threats" to the congregation was passed.
