We thank Robert Regier for the bulletin cover artwork. "Christians believe that Pentecost was the time when the churches were empowered with God's gift of the Holy Spirit. The descending dove and the flame have symbolized this Spirit from the earliest days of the Christian church. In this banner the consistency of the quilt pattern is interrupted by these two symbols. Fire is the incarnation of the Holy Spirit and is associated with Pentecost in the second chapter of Acts: "and there appeared to them tongues like flames of fire". In the gospels John testifies that "I saw the Spirit coming down from heaven like a dove". The dove has a range of meanings and is often regarded as a symbol of peace and reconciliation. The vertical, descending dove most often denotes the Holy Spirit and is frequently associated with baptism. The flames become the light source for the banner, and the colors gradually deepen as they move upward from the flames. Out of the darker hues emerges the descending dove. Lighter colors appear to advance, and so the color gradation from dark to light and cool to warm is intended to reinforce the downward movement of the dove -- the visitation of the Spirit." ~ Robert Regier
