Dec. 25 at BCMC: Attendance 148. General Fund \$9,127.75; Living Stones \$6,265; MCC Refugee Kits \$60; Gen Fund 2017 \$8,080; <i>The Mennonite</i> \$74; Caring Fund \$525; Homeless Shelter \$275; Bethel College Scholarship Fund \$1000; Living Stones 2017 \$3,000.

BCMC supports the Harvey County Homeless Shelter (recently re-named the New Hope Shelter) through help with volunteer staffing, meals, and money given through the Witness Commission budget. The Shelter is launching an attempt to raise \$300,000 for 2017, and is asking supporting churches to keep them in mind with their end of year contributions. Some of this money would be used to hire a family to live on the Shelter grounds and would serve to staff the facility overnight, making the need for us to recruit overnight volunteers unnecessary.
