The planning survey related to the BCMC Columbarium and Garden of Memory and Hope has been compiled. Thanks for responding. One hundred one surveys were completed with many representing more than one individual. Thirty-two already have other plans. Thirty-one have already purchased niches in the columbarium with one who prefers to shift to the Garden. Seventeen plan to purchase 33 columbarium niches in the future and 11 plan to purchase 20 agreements to scatter in the Garden. In addition to evaluating additional projects, the Living Stones II Task Force is also planning next steps related to the expansion of the Columbarium and construction of the Garden of Memory and Hope. How will the Garden (and all landscaping) be maintained? Is the large Columbarium expansion on the north of the church possible with a self-funded model? Are there alternatives to the columbarium that are aesthetically and theologically pleasing and financially feasible?

The Task Force hopes to bring a recommendation to the church board in time for additional discussion at the September 24 congregational meeting.
