

The carol, "Here We Come A-wassailing," today's anthem, was written in 1850 and, as a folk song, documented the beggars and orphans who moved from door to door hoping to find food or drink or money or a bit of warmth from the occupants of any home that would welcome them. This carol is a reminder that according to 2016 Feeding America statistics, one in five children in Harvey County struggles with not having enough food to eat. Today, the face of hunger exists in our community in the lives of our most vulnerable people, our children.
