

Income is short of expenses by \$17,400 at the end of November for the 2017 budget. Intents from the Pony Express are strong but total income projections for 2018 by the Finance Committee are \$30,000 less than budget requests. A strong finish for 2017 is important as the Church Board proposes a 2018 budget to the congregation.
