REMEMBERING 50 years of the MCC relief sale in Kansas The sale of a fluffy kitten started things off in 1973, with a refrigerator and combine



among the auction items that followed. The guilt event raised \$10,595, with \$1,020 the highest price paid. Twenty-two donated hogs and 13 hams (8 donated hams, 5 purchased) went into the successful production and sale of sausage. Local media inter-

viewed participants. The Friday night open house--the 4th so far--featured 11 15-minute programs by local churches. The entire sale generated \$45,787 for Mennonite Central Committee. In 1974, in contrast, \$68,400 went to MCC. 208 guilts and comforters brought in \$18,096, with a high price of \$820.
