

Attendance was down about half due to bad weather, but proceeds were almost the same as the year before. While that experience was important, my faith and understanding has matured through many experiences and been influenced by many others who have mentored me and helped me grow. At every time of my life, in every location where I have lived, there have been friends, leaders and role models who have challenged me to expand my understanding and commitment to a Christian lifestyle. It has been my desire to live a life which reflects the love that Christ expressed when on earth. Relating to the community of believers at Hesston Mennonite Church, and First Mennonite Church in Bluffton, Ohio has been very important to me. I now look forward to continuing my journey of faith at Bethel College Mennonite Church and anticipate your council and support along the way.

Faith Statement from Susie Swartley; Joining by transfer from First Mennonite Church, Bluffton, OH

My life as a Mennonite began at birth. My family attended Sunnyslope Mennonite Church in Phoenix, Arizona. There, I learned about God, living by the Golden Rule and being Mennonite. Rocky Mountain Mennonite Camp, where my parents were directors for 20 years, played a large part in my development during my teen years. I thrived on the hard work, meeting new people, and being surrounded by the beauty of the Rockies. Nature became an important part of my spirituality during those years and remains so today.

Bill and I were married in 1969. In the fall of 1971 we moved to Hesston, Kansas where Bill attended college. Hesston Mennonite was our church. We raised our three children in a three-story historic home a block away from the church and campus--we lived close to the action.

In fall 2008, my sister, who was my best friend, died unexpectedly of a heart attack (my brother had died 11 years earlier from MS complications). Family became even more important. The idea of living closer to one of our children sounded wonderful. The small-town feel of Bluffton won out over Portland, OR and the D.C. area. And now, nine years later, we are back in Kansas.

Today I am very happy to be joining you at BCMC. The style of worship, the music, and, you, the church family, enhance my life.
