Pause for Justice for Immigrants is an ecumenical group comprised of Wichita and Newton churches. Sept. 22, the group is having a postcard writing campaign where you are welcome to write postcards at your local congregation or join Shalom Mennonite Church at 4 pm to write a postcard. The cards will be hand delivered to the Wichita offices of Senator Moran, Senator Roberts and Representative Estes. The BCMC Witness Commission plans to have pre-printed postcards available for signing Sun., Sept. 22. You may send your card via US Mail or have it hand delivered to the Wichita offices. Join us in opposing funding for detention, deportations and border walls in any spending bill and opposing bill S. 1494 which would significantly undermine asylum protections for families and unaccompanied minors seeking safety in the U. S.

Nonviolence Week—Sept. 16-22 Join Kansas Institute for Peace and Conflict Resolution (KIPCOR) next week as they team up with Peace Connections, Bethel College, Newton Ministerial Alliance, Offender Victim Ministries and Harvey Arts Connect in recognition of the 2019 National Campaign Nonviolence Week of Action. Activities start with a Poverty Simulation sponsored by Peace Connections, 6:30 pm, Mon., Sep. 16 in Memorial Hall at Bethel College. On Wed., Sept. 18, the Colorado-based organization **RAWtools** will be on the college campus starting at 2 pm. RAWtools will transform guns into gardening tools to demonstrate its commitment to nonviolent problem-solving, with simultaneous activities inside Memorial Hall. RAWtools will also be at a Community Cookout, Thurs. evening, 5:30 pm, at the First Church of God, 620 Fairview Ave., Newton. The Ministerial Alliance-sponsored cookout will also feature a letter-writing campaign by Offender Victim Ministries, a community-created mural by Harvey Arts Connect, and a post-cookout film, Inside Peace. To cap off the week, Sun., Sept. 22, 7 pm, KIPCOR will host a lecture in Bethel College's Krehbiel Auditorium by Palwasha Kakar. The Bethel graduate and current U.S. Institute of Peace Senior Program Officer will speak on "Women's Role in Ending Violence and Building Peace: Reflections from Afghanistan and USIP." All events are free and open to the public. Check out the kipcor.org website for more details.
