From the Board: At the congregational meeting on Sun., Jan. 28, the budget for 2024 was approved as were several additional proposals. Specific wording of these proposals can be found in the annual meeting's booklet as well as several past bulletin announcements. After an editorial change of the last "and" to "or", the proposal to revise the Welcoming Statement was approved with 90 Yes votes and 1 No vote. The proposal for a new model of leadership (moderator elect, moderator, and past moderator) passed with 92 Yes votes and 1 No vote. The proposal to install solar panels on our church roof passed with 85 Yes votes and 4 No votes. Overwhelming support for the project in terms of funds pledged (approximately \$180,000) was reported. We're grateful for the extensive background research, hard work, and advocacy of the Creation Care Committee's subcommittee of Dwight Krehbiel, Lorna Harder, and Hugo Boschmann; the assistance with collaboration and communication from Margaret Toews and Jon Zerger of the Board; and the advice and collaboration of the Finance Committee (LaVern Stucky, Jerry Buller, Margaret Goering, Jeanette Leary, and John Zerger). We look forward to a good year ahead!

The Church Board thanks the Search Committee for their efforts: Thanks to Heather Esau Zerger and the rest of the committee (Doug Penner, Megan Kohlman, John Waltner, and Lois Preheim) for assertively taking initiative in search and recruitment. The Search Committee has been hard at work in an effort to fill BCMC's open Co-Pastor position. The Committee has identified possible candidates and is in the process of conducting interviews. We will continue to update the congregation as our progress continues. In the meantime, we appreciate your continued patience and prayers.
