From the Board: Solar Contract Signed!

In this season of Easter celebration, we again celebrate the church's support of the solar energy initiative and report that the contract with King Solar is signed and the down payment has been made. The proposal to install solar panels on our church roof passed at the January congregational meeting with 85 Yes votes and 4 No votes. Overwhelming support for the project in terms of funds pledged (approximately \$180,000) was reported. We're grateful for the extensive background research, hard work, and advocacy of the Creation Care Committee's subcommittee of Dwight Krehbiel, Lorna Harder, and Hugo Boschmann; the assistance with collaboration and communication from Margaret Toews and Jon Zerger of the Board; and the advice and collaboration of the Finance Committee (LaVern Stucky, Jerry Buller, Margaret Goering, Jeanette Leary, and John Zerger). We look forward to the pledges being fulfilled and the installation of panels scheduled for June! Plans for additional initiatives may be possible with the funds saved; stay tuned.
