Today's choir anthem is the final movement from Vivaldi's *Gloria*, a setting of the fourth century hymn text Gloria in excelsis Deo. This movement's text, Cum Sancto Spiritu in gloria Dei Patris, amen, is translated: With the Holy Spirit in the glory of God the Father, amen. The postlude is derived from Bach's cantata *Nun danket alle Gott* (*Now Thank We All Our God*, VT 114). This setting of the hymn, arranged by the American organist Virgil Fox (1912-1980), was made popular through Fox's flamboyant organ, smoke, and light shows of the 1970's. Perhaps not the most authentic Bach, it remains an enthusiastic presentation of this hymn of thanksgiving.
