In order to recognize and mourn the loss of our loved ones from 2024, Bethel College Mennonite Church is hosting a Service of Remembrance on January 5, 2025 at 4 p.m., in the BCMC sanctuary.

Today's anthem, "Der Friedensfürst," is a favorite of many German-speaking Mennonite congregations, particularly those in Latin America and Canada. It was composed by an American in English ("The Prince of Peace") and subsequently translated into German in the 1890's. It was written in the popular style of the day and is dearly loved by those who grew up with it. The paraphrased text contains these words: Listen, the angel choirs are singing, to you oh mighty Prince of Peace! To us a child is born today, and his glory fills the wide world. And he is called wonderful, the Prince of peace. Glory to God in the highest, and peace—God's peace—on earth. Sing Hosanna! Amen.
