- *God sent his Son* was requested by Kathryn Stucky who says: "I heard this hymn sung as a solo and was so moved by it many years ago."
- *O Power of Love* is a favorite hymn for many people and is not included in *Voices Together*. In a conversation with Kidron residents, Pastor Elizabeth notes that six BCMC congregants raised their hands when asked how many would like to sing "O Power of Love", after one person mentioned missing it and it's strong history of being sung in the former General Conference.
  - Janet Voth requested this hymn because her dad directed a men's choir that sang on a radio station and this was the theme song. "I also think love is very powerful," writes Janet.
  - Lenore Waltner notes that "the chorale, 'Ich bete an die Macht der Liebe,' (O Power of Love) included in our three previous hymnals, has been a favorite in many (General Conference) Mennonite congregations for generations."

Anabaptism 500 Worship Celebration. BCMC will host the live-stream of the May 29 worship service at Mennonite World Conference in Zurich, Switzerland, celebrating the 500th anniversary of Anabaptism. The live-stream begins at 10 a.m. in the BCMC Sanctuary. Join us in lifting glad voices with other Anabaptists around the world in this joyful celebration!

There is much that could be said about today's music! The centering music, Master Tallis's Testament, was composed by English composer Herbert Howells (1892-1983) in 1940. It begins with a quiet presentation of a theme inspired by 16th century composer Thomas Tallis and is developed in three variations that build in volume and complexity, contrasting 16th century modality with lush 20th century harmonies. The postlude, by living composer Aldred Fedak, is perhaps less substantial than the Howells, but I think it's a pretty neat musical description of the Holy Spirit coming at Pentecost in Acts 2: "Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them." Even though it is not yet Pentecost, I wanted to share this piece as I always seem to be out of town when Pentecost actually rolls around. Finally, the hymn O Power of Love deserves mention. A favorite hymn tune and text of many, it is somewhat befuddling why it was omitted from Voices Together. At any rate, its text by Tersteegen (Ich bete an die Macht der Liebe) and tune by Bortniansky seem a perfect match that Mennonites living in Russia adopted soon after its initial publication in the Choralbuch in 1825. It remains a much beloved Kernlied, the so-called core songs of the Russian Mennonites. Will Wiebe-Friesen
