Today's centering music is built on the hymn tune used in today's closing hymn, Life-Giver, Maker, God of All, with a text by contemporary Catholic lyricist Delores Duffner (b. 1939). The original text is translated "Alone to God in the highest be glory" and is a German paraphrase of the Gloria from the Latin Mass. Interestingly, it is believed that it was initially translated into a Low German dialect and later into High German, and it was likely familiar to our Low German Mennonite forebears in northern continental Europe. Typically sung every Sunday, Bach composed more settings of this hymn than any other. The version played today is highly ornamented and would take very careful listening to discern the chorale melody. A hymn of praise, this tune is often energetic and loud; however, Bach emphasises the phrase "...so that no harm can ever come to us any more" in this expressive, comforting piece. - Will Wiebe-Friesen
