**On January 4, we celebrated Epiphany by selecting "star words" to help guide us through the new year.** If you have not received a word and would like one, please email Pastor Joanna. For those of you who wish to engage your word as a spiritual practice this year, look for occasional prompts in your weekly church emails. (If you want to sign up for the emails, please contact the office.)

**Today's centering music comes from a larger work, *Triptych for Organ*,** by organist Alfred Fedak. This movement, a rondo for the trumpet stop on the organ, quotes the Lutheran hymn Werde munter, meine ge-müte (Become cheerful, my mind). As with many Lutheran hymns, singing all twelve stanzas is more of a marathon than a sprint! Despite its length, it was a much-loved hymn during Bach's era, and, with slightly altered rhythms and a different text, is the tune used in his beloved chorale prelude "Jesu Joy of Our Desiring" (text on VT 639). The other two movements in Fedak's Triptych will likely pop up in worship services over the next few months, so keep an ear out for them!
