BCMC Purpose Statement: Our faith in a God of love leads us, by the power of the Spirit, to follow Jesus in doing justice, loving mercy, and walking humbly with God.

LARGE GROUP GATHERING FOR INDOOR WORSHIP (more than 20 people)

In God's love, through caring love of neighbor and self, we will

- o Continue virtual gathering for worship for all who benefit;
- Gather in-person for worship when case data shows:
 - Harvey County two-week positivity rate is 3 5% or less (This positivity rate is recommended by W.H.O., we are using it for large group indoor worship because the larger group size increases the exposure risk)
 - All six Harvey County criteria are in green status
 - Ask God's blessing on all who gather;
 - o Ask God's blessing on all who stay home,
 - Whether sick or unwell,
 - With health conditions (heart/lung, diabetes, respiratory, immune-compromised)
 - With risk from aging (65+),
 - With family/household/caregiver responsibilities,
 - For health and for comfort,
 - While awaiting a vaccine.

We will NOT meet for indoor worship if someone who attended worship tests positive within 48 hours of attending worship, or if 2 or more church staff test positive.

BETHEL COLLEGE MENNONITE CHURCH COMMITMENTS FOR LARGE GROUP INDOOR WORSHIP

As loving shepherds of its flock, BCMC will:

- \circ $\,$ Provide hand sanitizer at each entrance/exit
- Provide disposable masks if needed
- o Provide vocal and instrumental music for worship
- Remove friendship pads and offering plates
- \circ $\;$ Run fans and open windows to reduce viral concentration
- o Limit sanctuary seating for physical distancing
- \circ $\;$ Shorten worship service length to 30 45 minutes $\;$
- Keep nursery closed children stay with family during worship service (including Children's Conversation), may exit to Gathering Place during service if needed
- o Cover drinking fountains to keep from use
- Encourage restroom use at home to minimize coming together with others in enclosed spaces; restrooms will be open for emergencies
- Prepare ushers on modified roles
- \circ $\;$ Actively listen and create new ways to shepherd the flock

PARTICIPANT COMMITMENTS

In God's love, through caring love of neighbor and self, we will:

- Stay home when unwell and/or when in doubt, or with health or aging risk conditions
- (As applicable) Abide by any retirement facility guidelines
- Wear masks on church grounds
- \circ Keep 6 ft of space between households indoors and out
- o Keep coats/hats/gloves/scarves together with us
- o Greet & pass the peace in touch-free ways, six feet apart
- o Refrain from congregational singing
- o Refrain from gathering in Gathering Place no coffee/mail
- o Prioritize south entrance for accessibility/proximity needs
- o Prioritize front (west) entrance for those able to walk farther
- \circ $\;$ Exit the building the same way we entered
- Visit outside, wearing masks, 6 ft apart
- Notify church office if test positive within 48 hours of attending worship

SMALL GROUP GATHERINGS (up to 20 people) FOR FAITH FORMATION, COMMISSION/COMMITTEE/TASK GROUP MEETINGS, AND SHARING ACTIVITIES

In God's love, through caring love of neighbor and self, we will

- Continue Zoom and on-line options for all near & far;
- o Gather outdoors when possible, weather-permitting;
- Gather indoors and in-person for faith formation & small group activities when case data shows:
 - Harvey County two-week positive case rate is 9% or less (aligns with USD #373 yellow and green modes)
 - \circ The two-week positive case trend is stable/decreasing;
 - Ask God's blessing on all who gather;
 - Ask God's blessing on all who stay home,
 - o Whether sick or unwell,
 - With health conditions,
 - With risk from aging (65+),
 - o With family/household/caregiver responsibilities,
 - For health and for comfort,
 - While awaiting a vaccine.

If a small group attendee tests positive within 48 hours of attending a small group BCMC event, that group will NOT meet again for a minimum of two weeks (14 days).

BETHEL COLLEGE MENNONITE CHURCH COMMITMENTS FOR INDOOR FAITH FORMATION & SMALL GROUPS

As loving shepherds of its flock, BCMC will:

- o Provide hand sanitizer at each entrance/exit
- Provide disposable masks if needed
- o Run fans and open windows to reduce viral concentration;
- Limit small group activities to 10 participants in Gathering Place and 20 participants in sanctuary
- Add Fellowship Hall when renovation is complete
- Limit time length of indoor group activities to under 2 hours *the shorter the time, the less exposure risk*
- Encourage restroom use at home to minimize coming together with others in enclosed spaces; restrooms will be open for emergencies
- Group Leader/Facilitator will keep track of attendance at event in case contact tracing is necessary
- Actively listen and create new ways to shepherd the flock

PARTICIPANT COMMITMENTS FOR INDOOR FAITH FORMATION AND OTHER SMALL GROUP EVENTS

In God's love, through caring love of neighbor and self, we will:

- \circ Stay home when unwell and/or when in doubt
- (As applicable) Abide by any retirement facility guidelines
- o Wear masks on church grounds
- Keep 6 ft of space between households indoors and out
- o Keep coats/hats/gloves/scarves together with us
- o Greet in touch-free ways, six feet apart
- Prioritize south entrance for accessibility/ proximity needs
- o Prioritize front (west) entrance for those able to walk farther
- \circ Exit the building the same way we entered, and visit outside
- Notify church office if test positive within 48 hours of attending a small group event
