Biography

- B Baerg Baerg, Anna, ***Diary of Anna Baerg***, 1985. Diary of a woman, born in Russia in 1897, who immigrated to Canada in 1924.
- B Fiol Fiol, Marlena & O'Connor, Ed, ***Called***, 2021. Relates how two Mennonite missionaries, John and Clara Schmidt, revolutionized care for people in 1940s Paraguay.
- B Friesen Friesen, Katie, ***Into the Unknown***, 1986. Friesen tells the story of her life from childhood in Gnadenfeld, through flight out of Russia in WWII, to a new home in Canada in 1947.

Non-Fiction

- 615.8 Ra Rankin, Lissa M.D., ***Mind Over Medicine***, 2020. Rankin teaches readers how to create a treatment plan aimed at bolstering the health-pieces of their lives.

Fiction

- F Harder Harder, Hans, ***No Strangers in Exile***, 1979. A story of the grim hardships faced by those forced from their Russian homes in the 1930s to settle logging camps in northern Russia.
- F Smith Smith, Alexander McCall, ***The Joy and Light Bus Company***, 2021. Precious Ramotswe is tempted to put the brakes on her husband's business venture before it even gets rolling. She also helps a concerned son who worries he will lose his inheritance.

Youth & Children

- JF Higuera Higuera Donna Barba, ***The Last Cuentista***, 2021. This middle grade dystopian novel follows Petra Pena who, with her family, flees Earth to continue the human race. After awakening on a new planet, only Petra remembers Earth and must use storytelling to keep memories alive. Newbery Award winner.
- E Wang Wang, Andrea, ***Watercress***, 2021. Caldecott Award winner. Inter-generational story. A family hunts for watercress and a girl learns of her mother's life in China.
