### Biography

- B Kirby Baldwin, Betty Kilby, ***Cousins***, 2021. A white woman and a black woman learn that they are cousins related through slavery. Activist partners, they commit to reconciliation.
- B Wyble Wyble, Robert, ***Life Together***, 2021. Wyble reflects on faith, love, and caring for a spouse with Alzheimer's disease.

### Non-Fiction

- 289.7 Ja Janzen, David, ***Seven Radical Elders***, 2020. Oral history of the seven radicals who met in an interracial house church and intentional community on Chicago's West Side during the Civil Rights Era. Janzen is a Hillsboro native.
- 616.02 Le Lee, Barbara Coombs, ***Finish Strong***, 2019. Coombs covers the tough issues around aging and dying, describing ways to achieve the positive end-of-life experience one wants for self and loved ones.
- 974.7 St Stanton, Brandon, ***Humans of New York***, 2013. Ranging from whimsical to heartbreaking, these stories of New Yorkers have something to say to every life.
- 289.73 St Stober, Clare, ***Another Life Is Possible***, 2020. Stunning photo essay paired with 100 stories gives a rare glimpse into the Bruderhof community.
- 248.8 Wa Warren, Tish, ***Prayer in the Night***, 2021. A prayerful approach to the difficulties faced at work, at home, and in a world filled with uncertainty.

- F Unger Unger, Andrew, ***Once Removed***, 2020. The author and founder of the satire website *The Daily Bonnet*, explores the costs of "progress" in this humorous story of a man tasked with writing a Mennonite town's history.
